EPHESIANS 6:14-24

Let's Get Started:

The supernatural war being fought throughout the universe that Paul describes in **Ephesians 6:11-12** is between God and His angels and the forces of Satan. But Paul also shows us that Christians are drawn into this spiritual conflict as well. Satan opposes believers in a lot of ways. Spirit-filled, bornagain Christians are subject to spiritual attacks, defeats, and even strongholds.

In his message this week, Pastor Jerry gives us 11 common ways Satan tries to lie to us and control our thoughts. Share if you have experienced any of these types of attacks in your walk with Christ.

- Denial a refusal to face the truth.
- Fantasy an escape from reality into a world of perversion, pleasure, or gaming.
- Withdrawal shutting down emotionally to avoid feeling reality.
- Displaced anger hurting others because you are not willing to deal with the source of your anger.
- Projection placing the blame for your thoughts, feelings, or behavior on others.
- Rationalization finding reasons to excuse your wrong behavior rather than changing it.
- Ideological fixation using godless philosophic, political, social, or psychological theories as your dominating worldview.
- Cult or occult involvement mind control through tarot cards, astrology, palm reading, Ouija board, etc.
- Irrational fears and suicidal thoughts.
- Mental reliance on an addicting substance.
- Unbelief choosing not to trust God or His Word.

Read Ephesians 6:16
