Sermon Title: Real Communicators of Hope Part 2

Scripture Passage: 1 Thessalonians 2:7-12

Getting Started Sharing from personal experience

1. Paul begins this section with a compelling image of what it means to be Spiritual leaders and guides. To the Thessalonian believers, he not only shared in their new birth as Christ followers, but he was also their Spiritual "parent". Paul continued to walk with them as they grew up in their faith.

Q: Have you had this kind of experience? Is there anyone in your life currently that you are a Spiritual "parent" to?

Observation Discovering the context

- 2. In verses 7-8, Paul makes statements about just how he cared for and loved the Thessalonian Church. He says, "But we were gentle among you, like a nursing mother...affectionately desirous of you...ready to share our own selves..." Look up the scriptures below. What is the common theme or thread running through each of them?
 - a. Numbers 11:12
 - b. 2 Corinthians 12:15
 - c. 1 John 3:16
 - d. Romans 1:11-12
 - e. 2 Corinthians 6:11-13
 - f. Philippians 2:17
 - g. Isaiah 66:3

3. What about living a "life of labor and hardship" sounds daunting or perhaps even scary?

4. According to verse 9, Paul and his companions worked "day and night" to provide for their own means, so as to not become a "burden" on the Thessalonians. Here the emphasis rests on the fact that they were called to sacrifice certain things for the Kingdom of God.

Q: What type of labor has God called you to sacrifice for as a disciple and servant of Jesus?

5. In verses 10-12, Paul reminded the Thessalonians of their behavior and conduct, and exhorts them to live a life "worthy of the God" who called them into "his own Kingdom and glory". The Bible teaches us two manifestations of the Kingdom of God that Jesus preached; the current invisible Kingdom and the coming of the future visible Kingdom.

Q: Which Kingdom is Jesus referring to in Luke 17:20-21?

Q: Which Kingdom is Jesus referring to in Matthew 13:41-43?
