Psalm 8; Psalm 139

Psalm 8 gives a glimpse into man's true origin, identity, and eternal worth.

- Psalm 8 begins and ends with the same theme: God is the majestic and powerful Creator of all things. (vs. 1, 9)
- Vs. 2 teaches us that even a small child can comprehend the majesty of God the Creator.
- Vs. 3 turns our gaze upward to study the order, the incomprehensible design and exquisite beauty of our solar system and beyond that God created.
- Vs. 4 poses the main question
- Vs. 5 defines man in glowing terms

Psalm 139 takes the telescopic lens of Scripture and turns it into a microscope

• Vs. 17-18 reveal God's love for us

Conclusion: Ten implications of Psalm 8 and 139.

- 1. God considers all human life sacred and valuable. Sick or well, young, or old...all life is precious.
- 2. Life begins at conception.
- 3. Unborn babies are precious human beings and must be protected.
- 4. Abortion is killing a child made in God's image.
- 5. Rescuing an unborn child is a noble moral cause for the church and Christians.
- 6. Helping a pregnant mother keep her unborn child is compassionate and right.
- 7. Your life is eternally significant to God, so never allow yourself to think otherwise.
- 8. God planned specific things for you to do. So, find God's will and do it.
- 9. The sacrifice of Jesus, the Son of God, places infinite and eternal value on believers.
- 10. In heaven, God will crown believers with glory and honor.
