# Pride and Prejudice James 2:1-13

**Introduction:** Sometimes we make assumptions that are wrong because we do not look at all the detail.

Theme of James 2:1-13: If you have real saving faith, you will treat people with *impartiality* and love.

**Faith and partiality do not mix.** Vs.1 My brothers, show no partiality as you hold the faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory.

## Two fundamental reasons why God hates favouritism.

- 1. All men are created by God.
- 2. Christ died for the sins of all mankind making every person infinitely valuable.

## A practical illustration of how favouritism works in a church. Vs. 2-4

- 1. First mistake: He didn't look beyond the <u>superficial to the heart</u>.
- 2. Second mistake: He didn't look beyond the <u>material to the spiritual</u>.
- 3. Third mistake: He didn't look beyond the <u>temporal to the eternal</u>.

## Obey three godly rules to avoid partiality.

- 1. **Obey the "royal law" vs. 8** If you really fulfill the **royal law** according to the Scripture, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing well.
- 2. **Obey the "law of liberty" vs. 12 So** speak and so act as those who are to be judged under the law of liberty.
- 3. **Obey the law of mercy. Vs. 13** For judgment is without mercy to one who has shown no mercy. Mercy triumphs over judgment.

## Conclusion: Seven golden guidelines to avoid sin of partiality

- 1. Let God set your standard, not how you were raised.
- 2. Acknowledge that partiality is a sin, it's wrong. Confess it to God.
- 3. Look deeper to find what is in someone's heart.
- 4. Treat everyone with love as God loved you.
- 5. You will find it easier to love others as you love yourself when you put yourself in their shoes.
- 6. Be merciful to those who fall because you will be judged with the same measure you use on others.
- 7. Make room for people with problems and you will make room for yourself.
